BUILDING POSITIVE STAFF AND VOLUNTEER RELATIONS






EXCEL BITESIZE 1: MANAGING YOUR DATA

EXCEL BITESIZE 2: CREATING A WORKABLE DATA SET

13th July 10.00am-12.30pm

You don't always have control over the format and type of data that you want to analyse when it's imported from an external data source, such as a database, text file, or a web page. And, if you're using Excel to record and store data on a daily basis, it's common to find inconsistencies such as spelling errors, incomplete postcodes, or incorrect date formats. Before you can analyse the data, you often need to clean it up.

EXCEL BITESIZE 3:ANALYSING YOUR DATA

14th July 10.00am-12.00pm

How can you identify gaps in your services? Highlight what's working and what isn't? And demonstrate your impact? Excel is the perfect tool for effectively and efficiently keeping track of information, analysing data, crunching numbers and presenting the results in an easy to understand way. Join us in this session where we will learn how to analyse and present findings so that it makes sense both to you and the people that need to understand the story of your work.

EXCEL BITESIZE 4: INTERPRETING AND PRESENTING YOUR SURVEY DATA

19th July 10.00am-12.00pm

Surveys are a brilliant way of gathering information from people but sometimes the results can be challenging to interpret & present. A good survey will include a variety of question types - multiple choice, rating scales and open-ended questions but each of these requires different skills and approaches to pull out the results effectively.

EXCEL BITESIZE 5: CREATING A DASHBOARD

20th July 10.00am-12.00pm

Robust, data informed decisions can help with your service planning and show what's already working to funders, commissioners and your key stakeholders. It can also help you make the case for change, evidence need in your funding applications and share your impact with the world.
